Great custodians of Moirang intending to lead succeeding generations from darkness to light worked and toiled for establishment of Moirang College in 1958 and their dream came into reality with its foundation on 5th March, 1963. Construction works were completed in 1965 with the helping hands of local people.



A decline College Campus

Initially it started as a night college in August, 1963 at Moirang Government. High School with a handful of teaching and non-teaching staff under a part time Principal, Shri Bimol Rendu Shekhar Guha. It shifted to the newly constructed building in 1967 and became a day college.

It was purely a private college run by a Governing Body constituted with Shri K. Gouro Singh, Ex-Education Minister, Shri M. Koirang Singh, Ex-Chief Minister and Shri H. Nilamani Singh, Ex-Dy. Education Minister as President, Secretary and Treasurer respectively. It was converted into a Grant-in-Aid College (1-6-1969) and later a Government College (4-9-1978). In the beginning, it was an institute of higher leaning in social sciences and humanities and afterwards science faculty was added in 1975. Previously it was affiliated to Guwahati University and later to Manipur University. The College was recognised by the UGC under Sec. 2(f) and 12B of the UGC Act, 1956. To-day, it has become the viable institute of higher learning in Moirang Sub-Division offering undergraduate Courses in Arts and Science Streams augmented with IGNOU Study Centre. Besides, it is running four Add-on Courses.

The College is fast developing as an ICT enabled learning centre adopting innovative methods in learning and teaching. Youths outreach programmes, college corporate activities, career counselling, remedial coaching, computer literacy drive, e-connectivity for access to global knowledge society etc. are some of the emerging features of the college. It is driving towards quality sustenance and growth by redefining its Vision and Mission, Inter-departmental Faculty Improvement Programme in the form of in-house symposium in routine manner, thrust on Minor/Major Research Projects with institutionalisation of a research committee and (intending) publication of an annual or bi-annual academic collection with ISBN etc. are some of the newly added values to the academic contents of the college.

Student Support Facilities

The college has students from diverse family backgrounds and different sections of people, rural, semi-urban, hilly areas, etc. It takes care for OBC, SC, ST, minorities and economically weak students with a view to promote equity among low literacy group. As such, various incentives are encouraged.

Career Counselling Cell (CCC)

The college has a CCC (formerly Career Counselling Committee) under the supervision of a committee with support from UGC. Programme Coordinator is the executive officer. It conducts motivational and career counselling from time to time. It could build up confidence building measures and open up new vistas of employment opportunities before the students.

Alumni Association

Corpus Fund

It is a self generated fund, contributed and managed by the faculty members. It is a device to augment the limited financial resources of the college resulting in the slow growth of the college in its pace of development in respect of infrastructure and academic activities. Admission Committee

There is a decentralised structural organisation in the administration and governance of the college of which Admission Committee is an important component. It manages the affairs relating to admission matters.

Examination Committee

Evaluation and monitoring of academic performance of the students is indispensable part of activities of an academic institution and performs the responsible works through its examination committee. The committee decides all policy matters relating to mechanisms of how the performance appraisals of the students could be checked. It conducts mid-session tests and annual examinations as per the university schedules.

B.A./B.Sc. Programmes

The college opens Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Arts in Degree Course. The traditional annual system is being replaced by Semester System from the academic session, 2010-11 as per ordinance of the Manipur University to which the college is affiliated.  - iv. Elective and Honours subjects (any three from the above subjects stream-wise)

Note-I: No student shall opt Chemistry/Botany/Zoology unless he/she has passed 10+2 examination with chemistry

Note-II: No student shall opt Computer Science/Mathematics/Physics unless he/she has passed 10+2 examination with Mathematics

Note-III: No student shall opt for Physics unless he/she has passed 10+2 examination with Physics

Note-IV: Subjects to be chosen stream-wise as per column A(d) shall be considered Elective Subjects and one subject to be offered as Honours in the 5th and 6th Semester should be included in the choice.

Note-V: Economics, Mathematics and Geography shall be considered Science Subject(s) according to the combination of electives.

Admission Procedure

From this academic session 2020-21, students seeking admission to BA/BSc. 1st Sem. should register first using the link www.onlineuhe.in . Without registration no student can be admitted.

The College Admission Committee deals with matters relating to admission of the students in various classes/semesters in conformity with the norms of the university etc. Students seeking admission in class B.A./BSc. Semester-I should secure 45 p.c. in aggregate in their last respective examinations. They must ensure that along with their admission they become at least a member of any one of the three campus clubs as well as cadet or volunteer of NCC or NSS without which their admission will be withheld. Admission will be confirmed/allowed subject to the completion of all formalities. Submission of application form shall not be taken for granted that admission is guaranteed.
