15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Moirang College envisions achieving the dire need to transform the traditional system of education into a holistic multidisciplinary system during the last couple of years. A Planning Board of the college constituted 10 years back has also been looking after the matter of transforming the system, designing modalities for starting job-oriented vocational courses and submitting to Manipur University where the college is affiliated. However, an institution without the autonomy status could do nothing effectively towards fulfilling the envisioned goals. After the implementation of the Community College and Bachelor of Vocation (B Voc.) programmes from the academic sessions 2017-18 onwards under the University Grants Commission (UGC), the institution could give an impetus on how skill development/ vocational programmes are integrated into the general mainstream higher education with the introduction of the Tourism and Aquaculture. The new system of skill courses where B Voc. Programmes are designed with a judicious mixture of 60% skill component and 40% general education component may be considered as the basis of fulfilling the vision of the college for becoming a multidisciplinary Institute. With the launch of NEP 2020, the College has been providing an opportunity to learn all possible branches of creative human endeavour including traditional arts & crafts or skills in the form of Lokvidyas as emphasised in the recommendations of the NEP 2020. The College was all set to enforce the Choice Based Credits System (CBCS) which later combined with the concept of the Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) and ultimately integrated into the CBCS-LOCF based NEP Syllabus adopted under Manipur University with the provisions of the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) where students may deposit their credits annually. As Moirang is a historical place with its people culturally well flourished and a place of tourists destination, courses related with art and culture of Manipur are being introduced in the Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) of 4 credits and Value Addition Courses (VAC) of 2 credits in addition to Core subjects in Science, Humanities, Literature and Mathematics; citing a few examples of such courses being Thang Taa (Traditional Martial Art of Manipur with Swords and shields), Khullang Eshei and Khunung Eshei (Traditional folk Songs of Moirang), Maibi Laiching Jagoi (Traditional Manipuri Folk Dance), Pena (Traditional Manipuri Musical Instrumental Play), theatre. As per provisions in the syllabus, curriculum and ordinances adopted under Manipur

University, students are provided with the flexibility to choose their own courses from diversified fields of study, the core subjects in humanities, science and mathematics, the skill enhancement courses (SEC), Discipline Specific Electives (DSE), Generic Elective Courses (GEC), Vocational Courses with Internships at the exit points, Professional Courses etc. with the flexibility to study or opt for Internships or Apprenticeship or Projects or Research or Community Outreach at an appropriate stage. More than 65 value-added courses are being offered with a wider choice of other allied subjects so that students may be given benefits at multiple exits and entry points with an accumulation of credits through the respective Academic Bank of Credits (ABC).

2. Delineate the Institutional approach towards the integration of humanities and science with STEM and provide the details of programs with combinations: As it is seen elsewhere in the country, the number of students pursuing Mathematics (Hons) or as one of the allied disciplines in the undergraduate level of study has now been declining which is not a positive symptom of development as Mathematics is considered as the father of all sciences. The College observes National Mathematics Day on 22nd December every year to spread awareness for the promotion and Popularisation of Mathematics. Moirang College has, therefore, encouraged students to opt for mathematics as one of the main or honours subjects in both Arts & Science streams with the much wider provisions for integrating as discipline elective and generic elective as per provisions under the NEP 2020. Apart from this, the College is also taking up a series of activities for popularisation of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics amongst the youngsters by organising awareness programmes and various other activities. In order to integrate humanities with mathematics and other science disciplines, as for example, various departments are offering quantitative papers like mathematical methods for economics as part of the BA (Hons) economics syllabus. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value Addition Courses (VAC), Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) and Generic Elective Courses (GEC) are some of the courses offered as multidisciplinary subjects other than the respective honours courses. The Bachelor's Degree with Honours /Research in a discipline is obtainable after 4 years (eight semesters) of study. A Bachelor's degree with Honours in a discipline may be awarded if a student completes pursuing 18 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 8 Value Addition Courses (VAC), 4 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) and 6 Generic Elective courses (GEC), with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 180 Credits.

3. Does the institution offer flexible and innovative curricula that include

credit-based courses and projects in the areas of community engagement and service, environmental education, and value-based towards the attainment of a holistic and multidisciplinary education? Explain. Yes! Moirang College offers the flexible and innovative curricula prescribed by Manipur University for the Four Years Undergraduate Programme (FYUP). A student has to opt for the Core papers along with the Discipline Specific Courses (DSC) which may be of the same stream as that of the core paper and Generic Elective (GE) courses which may not be from the same stream as that of the core papers. The courses also include Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) which may or may not be of the same stream as that of the core paper, Value added courses (VAC) which are designed for enhancement of the human value and skill development in a particular field and Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) as for example, AECC 1 which may be one of the English or MIL Communication and AECC 2(Environmental Sciences). Moirang College offers 65 Value Addition Courses (VAC) of 2 credits spreading over all 8 semesters which are also uploaded on the University website. In Research Methodology and Data Analysis, students are also expected to do research projects which are under the purview of community engagement and services, environmental education and multidisciplinary education. Some of the projects that students of Moirang College are assigned for the partial fulfilment of the Bachelor's Degree under the FYUP include the socio-economic conditions of the fishing community near Loktak Lake, the impact of digital media on the lives of the Thanga and Karang Islands at the heart of Loktak Lake, the applications of scientific methods in studies of the art, artefacts and cultural heritage of Moirang where Science can be integrated into the humanities subjects in the light of the NEP 2020 etc.

4. What is the institutional plan for offering a multidisciplinary flexible curriculum that enables multiple entries and exits at the end of 1st, 2nd and 3rd years of undergraduate education while maintaining the rigor of learning? Explain with examples. Moirang College has adopted the four years undergraduate programme (FYUP) with the provisions of the multiple entry and exit points at the end of the first, second, third and fourth years with the award of certificate, diploma, degree and degree with honours or research respectively. In the Ordinance, Syllabus and Curricula issued by Manipur University for adoption in its affiliating colleges, there was no provision for the training of students for the job oriented vocational course just before the exit at the end of each of the four-year degree programme. However, NEP 2020 strongly recommends the provisions for integrating skill development in general mainstream education with the provision of training students in the skill set which the student prefers to take up for sustenance or livelihood just after the exit of the course.

The College has therefore suggested the university authority to adopt the system of imparting skill-based job oriented vocational courses for 30 credits with the provision of internship at the industry partner whichever is applicable so that the students after the exit at the end of the first, second, third and fourth year of the FYUP may join in a particular skill sector for his/her livelihood or self-employment or entrepreneurship. Moirang College has signed MoUs with some reputed Industry partners in the fields of Agriculture, Media, Food, IT & ITeS, Sports and Healthcare Sectors where the students may be given training for 30 credits including internships. This is in line with the provision of integrating the earlier Learning Outcomes-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) in the present system of NEP 2020 syllabus and curricula which is interdisciplinary and after integrating into the NEP syllabus becomes, multidisciplinary in nature. The FYUP gives innovative ways within the curriculum framework to allow the student maximum flexibility in pursuing undergraduate courses. It also gives liberty to eventually design the degree with multiple exit options depending upon the needs and aspirations of the student in terms of his/her goals of life, without compromising on the teaching-learning, both in qualitative and quantitative terms. The Institution is offering various multidisciplinary papers such as GE, SEC and Value-added courses.

5. What are the institutional plans to engage in more multidisciplinary research endeavours to find solutions to society's most pressing issues and challenges? Moirang College encourages interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary research with the establishment of Students Innovation Hub and Science Corner where students from all streams irrespective of science or arts may join in a common platform discuss areas of research and work together in line with the recommendations of the NEP 2020. The college has identified thrust areas of research to promote multidisciplinary research and find the solutions to society's most pressing issues and challenges. On the basis of the identified area, the faculties indulge in the research and also guide the student researcher to find the hypothesis of the research and so Inhouse and external projects are being planned. One student of BSc Physics Hons Justice Konjengbam is working in the field of rocketry system under his own project called Project Cocoon who is now joining the Manipur Technical University Innovation Hub Team with his further research in the rocketry system. He aims at becoming a rocket scientist who loves to join the team of scientists under the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO). Some faculties of Physics are also working on the physical techniques in studies of Indian cultural heritage and they are initially working on dating and characterization of the potsherds excavated from the historic Ibudhou Thangjing a local deity worshiped by the people not only of

Moirang but also the people of Manipur. Electoral Literacy Club conducts research and survey skills 6. Describe any good practice/s of the institution to promote Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary approach in view of NEP 2020. Moirang is a culturally flourished, historically significant and economically viable place which is also a tourist destination. More emphasis is being given in studies of cultural heritage by taking all the science and humanities streams together in a common platform. Students are encouraged in opting VAC in the traditional dance and music, folk song and folk music, pisciculture, horticulture, agriculture, floriculture, traditional art & crafts etc. to promote research in these locally viable research areas. Tourist Guide Training (Hospitality)/Food & Beverages: The college collaborates with various societies in organizing programs and events which are historical, interdisciplinary as well as multidisciplinary in nature. Similarly, students are encouraged to involve themselves in interdisciplinary research projects, as well as science & society. For promoting the multidisciplinary interdisciplinary approach, a number of Generic Elective (GE) options which are in high demand by students and IT and IT enabled Services sectors are also promoted as courses to be offered to BSc physical sciences and BA Programme students from which they can choose one option. The Computer Science Department is now conducting various short term skill based courses in line with the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) and National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) under the scheme of the Prime Minister's Kaushal Vikash Yojana (PMKVY). The College also signed a MoU with organisations like the National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), Imphal in terms of training and research under the said IT/ITeS Programmes which are offered to students in both Bachelor of Science and Arts in the multidisciplinary approach.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

1. Describe the initiatives taken by the institution to fulfil the requirement of Academic bank of credits as proposed in NEP 2020. Moirang College has a committee dealing with the matters of the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) in line with the NEP 2020 which is a platform developed by National e Governance Division (NeGD) of the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India, having the facility/functionality of opening academic accounts by students and onboarding of eligible Higher Education Institutions (HEIs), in accordance with establishment and operation of Academic Bank of Credits in Higher Education Regulations, 2021 of the University Grants Commission(UGC). In our Institute, ABC is implemented under the supervision of a Nodal Officer appointed from

amongst the young teachers who is well versed in operating computer related works and IT/ITeS in view of the huge computational, digitally storing system of the academic credits earned by the students from all semesters over the 4 years of study registered with ABC for awarding degrees/diplomas/certificates taking into account credits earned by students. ABC will ensure the opening, closure and validation of Academic Bank Accounts, credit verification, credit accumulation, and credit transfer, redemption for students. We have taken the initiative of crediting the students on the basis of classroom lectures and tutorials. It has promoted such interdisciplinary papers, which could create awareness about India's rich past. These courses are prescribed by the parent department and designed in such a manner that it transcends beyond general understanding. Every student shall open an account in the Academic Bank of Credits which will provide him/her with a unique ID and will allow access to the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP). The Credits awarded to a student for the courses pursued in the College shall be accumulated in the Academic Bank Account of the student. The procedure for accumulation of credits earned, shelf life, redemption of credits, would be as per the UGC (Establishment and Operation of Academic Bank of Credits in Higher Education) Regulations, 2021 and their subsequent amendments. The validity of credits earned will be to a maximum period of seven years or as specified by the Academic Bank of Credits.

2. Whether the institution has registered under the ABC to permit its learners to avail the benefit of multiple entries and exit during the chosen programme? Provide details. Multiple Entry and Exit Points are stages where the students may have options for entry and exit in the academic programmes in Higher Education Institutions to be facilitated through the facility created by the Academic Bank Credit scheme in the manner as provided in the UGC "Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions". Moirang College has constituted a committee on implementing the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) which is working round the clock in enrolment of students in the system. The team led by a Nodal Officer shall coordinate the works on digitally storing the academic credits earned from various recognized institutes at the time of entry so that the degrees from an HEI can be awarded taking into account the credits earned from various courses of study in all the semesters spreading over the four years undergraduate degree programme. The committee also looks into the matter of calculating and converting the olden traditional marking system into the new credits accumulation system for those students whose credentials were not reflected in terms of the credits system. The students whose academic performances are credited in the ABC shall have the benefit of transferring their credits if he/she intend to

transfer from one institute to the other or he/she intends to return to the institute after a gap of some years on deputation or assignments. The benefits of multiple entries and exits at the end of the first, second, third and fourth years of the FYUP are endorsed by the credits earned in the previous semesters/years and accumulated in the ABC. 3. Describe the efforts of the institution for seamless collaboration, internationalization of education, joint degrees between Indian and foreign institutions, and to enable credit transfer. Institutionalisation of Higher education is crucial so as to have a holistic, engaging, flexible education system. The department will undertake a seamless collaboration of joint degrees discipline like History has multiple sub-themes and the department will formulate a quality education policy that will adumbrate global immersion of its students and motivate them to get overall exposure. Also, the department will encourage its students to take admission in foreign universities which will cater to their interests and enable credit transfer. The Department can provide facilities for seamless collaboration. However, the onus lies on the institution to streamline the modalities for enabling credit transfer. 4. How faculties are encouraged to design their own curricular and pedagogical approaches within the approved framework, including textbook, reading material selections, assignments, and assessments etc. As an affiliating Institute under Manipur University, Moirang College adopts the syllabus and curriculum designed by the university. However, the pedagogical approaches within the approved framework are different from one another which include traditional as well as digital methods. Moirang College encourages faculties to involve in workshops and seminars conducted at various levels to enhance themselves the knowledge of designing curricula under the NEP recommendations. Some teachers are involved in recommending text books for all the colleges for purchase under the Directorate of University & Higher Education, Government of Manipur. Dr Moirangthem Rajesh Singh of Manipuri Department and Rafijuddin Shah of Pol Sc Department of the College were members of the State Level Books Recommending Committee under NEP 2020. Most of the Teachers are encouraged to participate at the Faculty Development Programmes on pedagogical approach, question setting, evaluation and other new areas. Teachers have flexibility of organising discussions, quizzes, presentations, research projects within the approved framework. The College offers already designed courses that are approved by the University. However, the pedagogical methods including textbook, reading material selections, assignments, and assessments, are an integral part of pedagogy and each teacher develops her/his own approach within a broader framework. Pedagogical reports on the same are submitted for every academic session by each teacher. As Moirang College clearly understands that teachers must be at the centre of

the fundamental reforms in the education system, it helps re-establish teachers, at all levels, as the most respected and essential members of our society, because they truly shape our next generation of citizens. The institution is planning to do everything to empower teachers and help them to do their job as effectively as possible.

5. Describe any good practice/s of the institution pertaining to the implementation of Academic bank of credits (ABC) in the institution in view of NEP 2020. Moirang College has a committee constituted for proper implementation, control and monitoring of the academic bank of credits (ABC) with the appointment of a Nodal Officer, organises orientation programmes to familiarise students about the Academic bank of credits (ABC) in the institution. The Committee also looks after how ABC shall be linked to the National Academic Depository (NAD) through a digital locking system. The Computer Science Department is working on how a common depository can be achieved through AI based digital locking system of all the academic credits along with the academic records and activities through a common platform. Manipur University has adopted the ABC from the year 2021 and all students who are enrolled in the first semester should have registered under the ABC. Being a constituent college of the University, Moirang College should follow the norms laid down by the University in due course of time. The institution is imbued with the zeal of overall development of the students. The students will be made to comprehend about the benefits of Academic bank of credits and its positive outcomes.

17.Skill development:

1. Describe the efforts made by the institution to strengthen the vocational education and soft skills of students in alignment with National Skills Qualifications Framework Moirang College has been striving for the knowledge acquisition and upgradation of skilled human abilities and livelihood through proper training of students in the field of various skill sectors preferably Agriculture, Tourism & Hospitality, Traditional Art & Craft of the locality, enhancement of the culturally flourished Skills (Lokvidya) of the people as emphasised in the NEP 2020 recommendations. To achieve the envisioned goals, Manipur University also sets out various Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) which are subject specific only and other skill-based value-added courses (VAC) which may be aligned with the proper skill qualifications. Moirang College started skill based vocational programmes under the community college scheme and B Voc. scheme of the University Grants Commission (UGC) from the year 2017-18 onwards. The College has two courses viz Advanced Diploma Programme in Tourism & Hospitality and B Voc. Degree Programme in Aquaculture affiliated under Manipur University. The syllabus and

curriculum of the skill based vocational programmes are so designed that 60% of the whole weightage would be of the Skill Education Component and 40% is of the General Education component. The assessment of the 60% skill component is done through the respective sector skill councils or local certified assessors in case of the local skills such as the 'Lokvidya' while the examinations for the 40% general education component is done through the semester wise examinations under the affiliating university. Moirang College offers Pena, the local traditional musical instrumental recital which is very famous in Manipur and an integral part of the Manipuri Society. The core skills on how the traditional 'Pena recital' is performed shall be trained by locally available eminent trainers while the theoretical backgrounds and other information related with Pena recital is taught as general component by the existing teachers in the related subjects. The skill components are always aligned with the National Occupational Standards (NOS) which are set out in the National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF) of the respective skill sectors. For those trades for which Qualification Packs (QP) are not available in the NSQF, the college constitutes a committee to design the QP of the local skills in line with the NOS or the NSQF as envisaged in the NEP 2020. Moirang College intends to make every effort to ensure effective curriculum delivery through a well-planned documented process.

2. Provide the details of the programmes offered to promote vocational education and its integration into mainstream education. Moirang College has offered Community College Advanced Diploma Programme in Tourism & Hospitality Sectors and Bachelor of Vocation Programme in Aquaculture under the NSQF. Apart from this skill based vocational programmes, the College also offers value addition-based courses viz NCC, NSS, Pena, Thang Taa, Pung Cholom (traditional mridangam), Khullang Eshei, Khunung Eshei, Theatre, Writing for Media, News Reporting and Anchoring, Documentary Film Making, Soft Skills, Personality Development, Cyber Security, Maibi Laiching Jagoi etc. Soft Skills are offered from a pool of courses for skill enhancement designed under the affiliating university, Creative Writing for Media where students make advertisements, banners and also learn to write blogs, English Language offered as an SEC course, Language Fluency and Proficiency courses tend to increase employability of students.

3. How the institution is providing Value-based education to inculcate positivity amongst the learner that include the development of humanistic, ethical, Constitutional, and universal human values of truth (satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love (prem), nonviolence (ahimsa), scientific temper, citizenship values, and also life-skills etc. Moirang College always encourages value-based education by offering various value-added courses that would strengthen the humanistic, constitutional, universal human value of

truth, righteous conduct, peace, love, nonviolence, scientific temper, citizenship values and other life skill based local vidyas. The Political Science Department conducts awareness programmes on constitutional values which are routinely organised on significant days such as the republic day, constitution day, national voters day etc. apart from these, the history department conducts programmes on National integration, Ek Bharat Shresta Bharat, Ahimsa(Non-Violence), Gandhi Quiz, other different activities like constitutional values and fundamental duties, ethics and culture, Panchksha: Holistic Development of Personality, Swachh Bharat, the art of being happy, Fit India etc to inculcate positivity amongst the learner that include the development of humanistic, ethical, constitutional, and universal human values of truth (satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love (prem), nonviolence (ahimsa), scientific temper, citizenship values, are organised round the year with an objective to develop the students in a holistic approach. 4. Enlist the institution's efforts to: i) Design a credit structure to ensure that all students take at least one vocational course before graduating. Moirang College is planning to train students a 6 months vocational training for 30 credits in the skill sectors of their own choice before leaving the college at each exit of the 4 years undergraduate programme. This vocational training shall be in line with the objectives of the earlier LOCF (Learning Outcome based Curriculum Framework) where the student has to opt for the suitable skill sector with which he or she should sustain life or become entrepreneur or self-employed and the vocational training imparted to the student at every exit point should also consist of at least 3 months internship programme at the industry partners. The total 30 credits should be split into 15 credits in the exclusive training in the College or the Industry Partner and 15 credits intern. The college regularly conducts workshops, seminars, webinars and short courses on soft skills, life skills, language skills and ICT to train its students and increase their employability. The focus is also on motivating students towards entrepreneurship through Entrepreneurship, Skill Development and Innovation Cell. Under new NEP based undergraduate curriculum framework, college offers different papers carrying different credits. College also has a fishery pond dedicated for students. Students who intend to go for fishery after the exit points at the end of the first, second, third and fourth years, he/she may opt for aquaculture where he/she should get training for 3 months and go for their own pisciculture activities for another 3 months with high yielding fishes. Only after the completion of this training he/she would be certified for the Bachelor Certificate, Bachelor Diploma or Bachelor Degree whichever is applicable as per provisions under the multiple exit and entry point systems of the NEP 2020. Besides, some add-on and

value-added courses are being run in the college to increase employability of the students such as Certificate course in travel and tourism, Computer Hardware, DTP, Animation, Creative Writing, Content Writing, IT/ITeS, Microsoft Powerpoint, Cyber Crime, Value added course on Yoga, NCC, NSS, Art of Living, Integrated Farming, etc.

2. Engaging the services of Industry veterans and Master Crafts persons to provide vocational skills and overcome gaps vis-à-vis trained faculty provisions. Moirang College invites many eminent personalities from time to time in organising various skill development programmes. There are many culturally flourished people in Moirang and most of them are the alumni of this college. Students are trained in the field of aquaculture and fishing skills by inviting many experienced fish farmers from Moirang and Thanga areas. Eminent Folk Singers is also invited in training the students in Folk Singing. Moirang College has a theatre circle where students can give exposure of their talents in the field of theatre. Recently, the students of Moirang College have successfully staged a theatre play entitled Ningol Macha Leiringei based on the supreme sacrifice of a Manipuri Muslim Family during the Anglo Manipur War of 1891. The play focuses the role of a Muslim Photographer Dasu Sardar, an unsung hero of the freedom struggle who acted as secret agent/informer to protect Yubraj Tikendrajit Singh from arrest by the British on the eve of the Anglo-Manipuri War of 1891. More than 100 students were trained in the field of theatre through the production of the historical play which is one of the objectives of the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, 75 Years of India's Independence where unsung heroes are being produced to create the sense of patriotism amongst the students, which is also an objective of the NEP 2020.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

1. Delineate the strategy and details regarding the integration of the Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture etc,) into the curriculum using both offline and online courses. Moirang College offers certain courses like B.A. in Manipuri which is a Major Indian Language, B.A. History where Indian Knowledge System has been integrated into the general mainstream education. We have plan for value addition courses in Manipuri Traditional Dance and Folk Music which integrates various aspects of the Indian Knowledge system into their curriculum. Keeping in mind the student diversity in class, the faculty appropriately chooses a pedagogy delivery style that meets the needs of the students. The Indian education system produced great scholars such as Charaka, Susruta, Aryabhata, Varahamihira, Bhaskaracharya, Brahmagupta, Chanakya, Chakrapani Datta, Madhava, Panini, Patanjali, Nagarjuna, Gautama,

Pingala, Sankardev, Maitreyi, Gargi and Thiruvalluvar, among numerous others, who made seminal contributions to world knowledge in diverse fields such as mathematics, astronomy, metallurgy, medical science and surgery, civil engineering, architecture, shipbuilding and navigation, yoga, fine arts, chess, and more. Indian culture and philosophy have had a strong influence on the world. These rich legacies to world heritage must not only be nurtured and preserved for posterity but also researched, enhanced, and put to new uses through our education system. Moirang College stands at the heart of the historic Loktak Lake, which is the only largest freshwater lake in the North East which is considered to be the origin of all forms of Art & Literature of Manipur and the college fosters its students in the Indian System of Education.

2. What are the institutions plans to train its faculties to provide the classroom delivery in bilingual mode (English and vernacular)? Provide the details. English and Manipuri vernaculars are used in teaching to ensure effective understanding among students of the concepts being taught. But the students are allowed to write in English in the examinations. Reference books, text books and other class notes are therefore given in English medium only except those of Manipuri (MIL) subject. Most of the subjects are taught in both Manipuri & English but the English is taught in English medium only. Students are provided reference material and notes in English only. Faculties are trained through Faculty Development Programmes, Orientation Programmes and Refresher Courses conducted from time to time under the affiliating University.

3. Provide the details of the degree courses taught in Indian languages and bilingually in the institution. There are thirteen BA/BSc degree programmes in the college viz BSc. Botany, BSc. Chemistry, BSc. Computer Science, BA. Education, BA. Economics, BA. English, BA. Geography, BA. History, BA. Manipuri, BSc. Mathematics, BSc. Physics, BA. Pol Sc, BSc. Zoology. The courses are all taught in bilingual medium except Manipuri which is taught in Manipuri language.

4. Describe the efforts of the institution to preserve and promote the following:

1. Indian languages (Sanskrit, Pali, Prakrit and classical, tribal and endangered etc.: Moirang College has submitted proposals to the affiliating University to grant permission for opening courses in Folk Music, Folk Dance and Thang Ta (Swords & Shields) the Martial Art of Manipur.
2. Indian ancient traditional knowledge: Moirang College provide courses on BA (Hons) in Manipuri and History where Indian ancient traditional knowledge system is being taught.
3. Indian Arts: Moirang College provides courses on BA (H) in History under which various topics cover Indian Arts
4. Indian Culture and traditions: Moirang College provides BA (Hons) programmes in Manipuri and History where Indian Culture and traditions are taught. Indian culture and traditions are also reflected in the syllabus and

curricula of the BA (Hons) Political Science and Education 5. Describe any good practice/s of the institution pertaining to the appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course) in view of NEP 2020. In view of NEP 2020, the college is offering BA (Hons) in Manipuri, History and Political Science in which the institution is pertaining to integrate Indian Knowledge system teaching in Indian Language, Culture using online courses.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

1. Describe the efforts made by the institution to strengthen the vocational education and soft skills of students in alignment with National Skills Qualifications Framework. Moirang College has introduced a computer science department to strengthen the vocational education and soft skills of students in alignment with the NSQF as the basic knowledge of computers is compulsory for all courses under the National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF). The College intends to make every effort to ensure effective curriculum delivery through a well-planned documented process. The college has been pursuing the affiliating university to offer Value Added Courses and Skill Enhancement Courses like Data Analysis with Python, Research Methodology, Data Analysis using Excel and R. Various workshops on academic writing, machine learning etc. are also conducted. Short-term skill-based courses are also introduced in DTP, Office Excel, Microsoft PowerPoint, Photoshop etc to make students job-ready after the completion of the courses. 2. Provide the details of the programmes offered to promote vocational education and its integration into mainstream education. The Computer Science Department is conducting various certificate courses in Microsoft Office, PowerPoint, and other job-oriented courses. The English Department conducts communicative English Courses, Social Media Writing, News Reporting, Documentary Film Writing, Anchoring and Voice etc. The college aims at introducing add-on courses in making advertisements, and banners and also learning to write blogs, Editing, Graphics and animations. 2. How the institution is providing Value-based education to inculcate positivity amongst the learner that include the development of humanistic, ethical, Constitutional, and universal human values of truth (satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love (prem), nonviolence (ahimsa), scientific temper, citizenship values, and also life-skills etc. Moirang College has drafted modules for value-added courses on ek bharat shresta bharat, non-violence, constitutional values and fundamental duties, ethics and culture, Swachh Bharat, The art of being happy, Fit India etc to inculcate positivity amongst the learner that includes the development of

humanistic, ethical, constitutional, and universal human values of truth (satya), righteous conduct (dharma), peace (shanti), love (prem), nonviolence (ahimsa), scientific temper, citizenship values, and also life skills etc. 3. Enlist the institution's efforts to:

- a. Design a credit structure to ensure that all students take at least one vocational course before graduating. The concept of a learning outcome-based curriculum framework(LOCF) clearly indicates the requirement of at least vocational and skills training at every exit point in the entire four-year degree programme of the NEP syllabus. Moirang College has submitted a proposal to the affiliating university for offering at least one vocational skill-based course for 30 credits including an internship of 15 credits at every point of exit during the whole BA/BSc Programme so that a student after exit from the course should be ready to take up jobs/entrepreneurial activities for sustenance and livelihood just after the exits.
- b. Engaging the services of Industry veterans and Master Crafts persons to provide vocational skills and overcome gaps vis-à-vis trained faculty provisions. Moirang College organises different skill development programmes under the skill development cell from time to time. It ranges from small skill development programmes to mechanics. The different resource persons have been invited from pan India for the same.
- c. To offer vocational education in ODL/blended/on-campus modular modes to Learners. Blended learning is becoming more and more prevalent and it is vital for higher education and corporate training settings to create strategic plans and directions, focusing on pedagogical techniques. There is qualitative research using an interview technique with a trainer who applied a blended training model at a vocational organization.
- e. Skilling courses are planned to be offered to students through online and/or distance mode. Moirang College is planning to offer different papers on skill development through online and/or distance mode. Distance mode is equally applicable in training students for vocational education. ODL provides a wider spectrum of resources for demonstrations and training modules where students can easily access their requirements without wasting time. Practical classes can be done through video demonstrations, graphics and animations. Nowadays, animation has become one of the most advanced and popular modes of demonstrations in the healthcare, agriculture, apparel, beauty and wellness etc sectors in the skill councils.

4. Describe any good practice/s of the institution pertaining to the Skill development in view of NEP 2020. The College has organised workshops for sensitizing faculties and students on how skill education can be integrated into general mainstream education as per the recommendations under NEP 2020. Diploma in Tourism and hospitality and B Voc. Programme in aquaculture have been approved under the UGC and the College has taken up necessary

follow-up action towards the grant of permission for opening the courses under the affiliating university.

ODL provides a wider spectrum of resources for demonstrations and training modules where students can easily access their requirements without wasting time. Nowadays, animation has become one of the most advanced and popular modes of demonstrations in the healthcare, agriculture, apparel, beauty and wellness etc sectors in the skill councils. Using various online websites and other social networking apps we aim to reach a large population of previously unreached people who can now benefit from educational and training opportunities. For economic development and prosperity skill training and ODL as the mode of vocational education and training are some of the beneficial tools. The Institution aims to introduce interdisciplinary papers in juxtaposition of vocational courses that can be taught using above mentioned online websites. 2. Describe about the development and use of technological tools for teaching learning activities. Maximum effort is given to the use of technological tools for teaching learning activities at Moirang College. Faculties are encouraged to extensively use ICT-enabled tools and online e-resources for effective teaching and learning processes and to support, enhance, and optimize the delivery of curriculum. All the teachers are trained through various programs on a regular basis for developing e-content and its effective dissemination for the benefit of students. Seminar Halls, classrooms and laboratories are equipped with projectors. The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled to provide easy internet access to faculty and students. Many departments are equipped with printers and scanners. Various platforms like Zoom, Google Meet, Microsoft Teams, Gmail, WhatsApp, Telegram, Google Docs etc. are used to manage and post course-related information- learning material, quizzes, lab submissions, evaluations and assignments etc. WhatsApp groups are created for all the Departments so that they can communicate anytime with their students.

Manipur has witnessed violence since Wednesday, May 3, 2023, with clashes between Kukis and Meities. Due to this nearly 8000 people from the Meitei community are taking shelter in 56 relief camps in the Bishnupur District.

Evidence of success: On 8th May, 2023 a relief camp was set up at different blocks of Moirang College. Dr. Mairembam Rajesh Singh of the Manipuri Department was appointed as the nodal officer of the relief camp. In association with various stakeholders of the college, he organized regular health check-ups, helped in sending children to schools, as well as successfully distributed relief materials to the inmates and many more.
